Also this level of rainfall far exceeded the 5-day 90 th percentile event of 51.8mm for the Newcastle region, as specified in the Blue Book (Landcom, 2004). This resulted in a TSS reading of 95mg/L. Metromix will then look to complete the wheel wash overhaul as soon as possible in 2024. |
